

Our 2022 Cancer Unwrapped teen essay contest was a heartwarming and wonderful event. To date, we have

received over 7,000 essays over 16 years from all 50 states, giving teens a chance to be heard and tell their stories. And we listened. After the essays were read this year by national judges, we chose 20 winners from 14 states and each winner received \$1,000. The teens reading their heartfelt stories about their personal diagnosis or that of a loved one at the virtual reception is always the highlight and is touching and powerful to family, friends and judges attending.

"Cancer Pathways is a safe space to learn, to share and celebrate little triumphs in a disease that takes away the essence of your being. As the only living member in my family that has had cancer, I feel that God wants me to share my story."

SPOTLIGHT ON ANTHONY TIPPINS

Anthony was introduced to Cancer Pathways more than a decade ago by his friend, Rose Dennis. He quickly

became the go-to for fashion show choreography and coaching the models at our annual, premier event. He kept his childhood cancer experiences quiet — he was diagnosed with testicular cancer at 13 — as he listened to models share their stories at a fashion show meeting.

"My heart and spirit silently wept as I heard the stories of these survivors and warriors fighting for their lives in various stages of their treatment," Anthony said. Aside from his grandmother's help, Anthony felt alone at 13. His mother died of breast cancer when he was 3.

At the second models meeting, Anthony spoke about his experience. "I wasn't alone anymore," he said.

Five years ago, Anthony received a second cancer diagnosis: anal cancer. He modeled in the show that year.

"To teach someone how to walk the runway as a fashion model is scary yet empowering," he said. "To announce that 'I have survived and don't I look great' —now that's what I call a happy ending. In cancer, there is not always a happy-ever-after. I love supporting Cancer Pathways because it supports people and families that are affected emotionally and physically with cancer. It gives them back their voice. It tells them you are not alone."

WELCOME EMILY


